

via its staff and students undertaking counselling and supplying food to needy families. through organized group cooking kitchens "Takaya."

We avail this opportunity to renew our commitment to continue supporting the UNGC principles, the Business 4- Peace initiative, and the SDG, wishing peace, stability, dignity, and progress to our country.

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1. Ahfad University for Women (AUW) in brief

AUW is a non-profit making institution that was established in 1966. It enrolls women from all over the Sudan and empower them to play productive role and lead their families and the community at large. Civic engagement and corporate social responsibility have constituted integral parts of its academic programs as well as it

rural extension activities, stemming from its philosophy to develop the rural communities and Sudanese women in general. That was clearly reflected in the mission of the university.

All AUW students (9.639 in 2022) and staff (almost 650 in 2023) participate in academic programs and implementing its activities, which follow communityoriented curricula in line with the international standards and the national needs. Sustainable Rural and and Development, MSc in Humanitarian and Post Disaster Development, M Sc of besides the Doctorate programs Pharmaceutical Biotechnology, The university curricula covers issues related to gender, democracy, poverty, diversity, population education, human rights and peace, which are imbedded in the undergraduate and postgraduate programs.

2. Incorporating UNGC principles into Activities of AUW

2.1. AUW Scholarships Program and Financial Aid for 2022-2024

The policy of students' intake to AUW stipulates providing financial support and waiving of tuition fees to students who come from poor families and remote disadvantaged areas in Sudan, including South Sudan, as well as, needy foreign students who join from neighboring countries under strife such as Somalia. In the academic year 2022/2023, almost 21% of the students received full scholarships as a grant, 19% has been enrolled with reduced or waived fees, while the remaining 60% paid full fees.

By the break of the war on 15th April in Sudan, study was ceased. However, on continuing its education on line in April 2024, all students who were on scholarships were decided to continue receiving the financial support they granted before the war, catering for the economic hardship families were facing in addition to the war trauma. The decision was intended to encourage female students to continue their education and to support their families. Accordingly, almost 3000 students were covered by the financial grants.

3. Incorporating UNGC principles into Activities of AUW

3.1 AUW Alumnus Celebrating the First Place in the CSR Arabia Award

In 2022, AUW Alumnus Safiya Elfadni, graduate of the School of Medicine achieved the first place in the prestigious award of CSR Arabia, which recognizes businesses leading Social Impact in Middle East and North Africa. Safiya is the founder and chairperson of Salam Social Enterprise.

The Arabia CSR Awards recognizes and honours organizations in the Arab Region that demonstrate outstanding leadership and commitment to Corporate Social Responsibility and sustainability. regionally and globally as the sustainability benchmark of the Arab Region, the award has grown and expanded its ambit considerably.





3,2. AUW Celebrating the 16 Days of Activism

As part of AUW celebrations of the annual 16 days of activism against violence against women, a competition was called for by the Gender and Reproductive Health, and Rights Resource and Advocacy Center (GRACE) in November 2022 to AUW students to use their talents and creativity in making use of photography, painting, poetry, art designs and writing to participate in setting solutions for ending violence against women and girls, within a month. AUW used to hold various activities annually coinciding with the annual international campaign that seeks to end all forms of Gender Based Violence (GBV).



3.3. Ending Violence against Women and Girls (VAWG)

On December 2022, GRACe and Ahfad Trauma Center in collaboration with NCA

celebrated the 16 Days of against Gender Based Activism Violence (GBV), under the theme Ahfad: "Orange End violence against Women Now". The celebration targeted Ahfad High School female student (130) and 10 teachers. It also included 120 AUW female workers. Besides, on December 5, 2023 GRACE held a Training of Trainers "TOT" in Advocacy Skills for ending FGM and Child Marriage in collaboration with NCA".

3.5. AUW the HUB for SDG 5 : Gender Equality










3.7. Annual Celebration of Women's Day 2022

As part of the international Women's Day Celebration, that AUW students used to hold annually under different themes, the student Yasmin Hashim Khalifa, delivered an interesting talk on the 11th March 2022, about the Memory of Sheikh Babiker Badri, the founder of the Primary Girls'

education in Sudan, and how he struggled hard and stood against the opposition of the British Administration, to start the first class at his own house, enrolling his nine daughters and few girls from the neigbourhood in 1907, at Rufaa city. That was the sparkle that ignited the move women's education in Sudan towards which later on was developed by his son 'Professor Yousif Badri' to establish Ahfad University for Women, resulting in an influx of more than 28,000 graduates feeding the Sudanese labour market with various specialization, and becoming a pioneer in mainstreaming women and

gender studies in higher education and research.
